Her father liked the man but not so much the soldier and tried everything in his power to make him change careers. The West Point Cadet, however, was as hellbent on becoming a great battlefield commander as his sweetheart was on becoming his wife. He made a perfect choice because, as *Lady of the Army* shows, George Patton would never have reached the heights he did without Beatrice Ayer.
